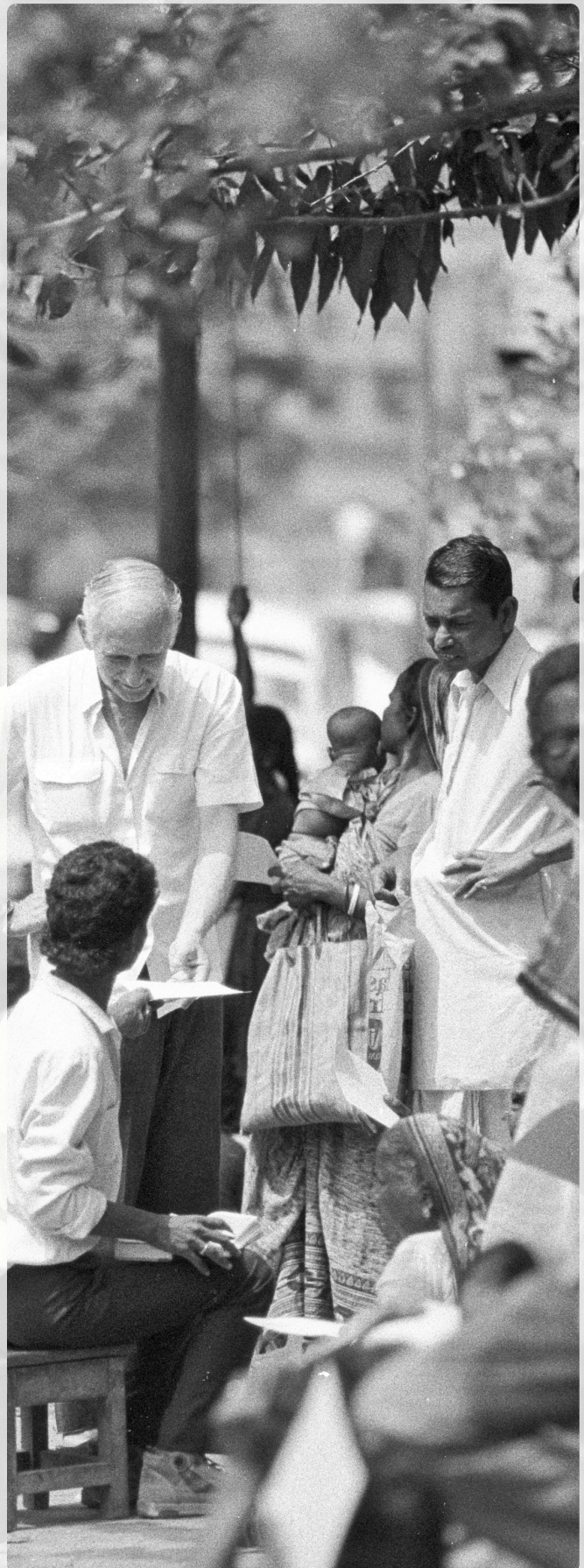

GOVERNING COUNCIL REPORT FOR 2023-24

Heartfelt greetings on behalf of all Calcutta Rescues Beneficiaries.

The year started with Calcutta Rescue expanding its living standards project, by **changing the face of a Dakshineswar slum from muddy unapproachable conditions to a neat cement paved pathway & initiated transformation of temporary bamboo hutments to customized semi permanent dwellings.**

Our students kept the Education projects flag flying by producing best ever results in board exams. **Kudos to Ms Ananya Chatterjee & her dedicated team, that did yeomen work in dispelling gender biases, with the help of overseas volunteers** (Dutch photographers, with Esther Sulkers as the Coordinator) through a uniquely planned workshop using mobile phones, that helped students create wonderful eye opening stories. Courtesy the UK based Helga Tod foundation, some of our teachers upgraded their skills by completing the 3 years training program. In addition some students & staff members also attended Peer Leadership Workshops for Change Agents organized by APPI.

A fillip to our New Healthcare Strategy focusing on Preventive rather than Curative treatments, was given by initiating tie-ups with **(a) CMRI Hospital for free treatment of CR's patients (b) CCRI for both free treatment & joint awareness drives , including Cervical Cancer Screening by (a) Mr Samindra Roy our former Hony Secretary & well-wisher & (b) Mr Sneathish Bhaumik our GC Member.** To keep our patients in good cheer, a Durga puja Pandal Hopping Programme was also organized.

Sad news struck CR with the passing away of Sister Cyril an oldest friend, philosopher, guide & former Hony Secretary . We closed our Projects mid day, enabling the majority of us to pay homage to the noble soul.

Your continued support ,ideas & suggestions will enabling us to optimize our reach amongst beneficiaries, in keeping with our quest for **“Create Opportunities & Transform Lives”** of the underprivileged segment of our society.

Discussions on creation of a statue / virtual museum of Dr Jacks work , finally fructified into his room, post decor with vibrant photographs, citations, press clippings and other articles, showcasing the good work done over the years by Dr Jack Preger, being opened to public in Feb'24.

A number of us at CRK are eagerly awaiting the completion of a virtual museum of Dr Jack , that was discussed and contemplated by SG's & spearheaded by the Swiss SG , who had also requested for the shipment of articles , used by him & left behind in his room, for this purpose. The showcasing of this virtual museum , amongst prospective donors will help CRK generate , much needed funds.

Our Arsenic water filter project at Malda, that was not closely monitored post the pandemic was revisited & all 12 water filters were examined and set right.

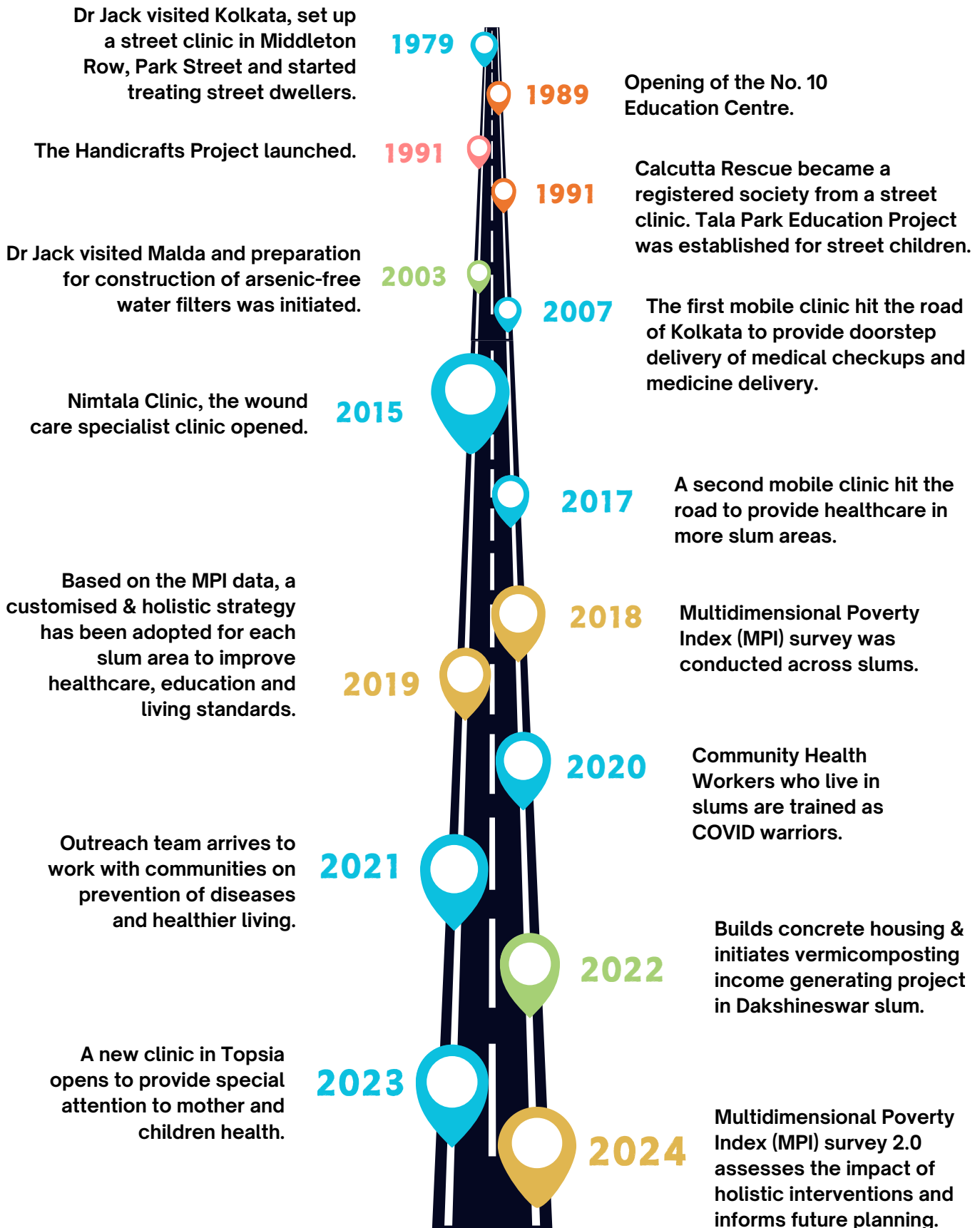

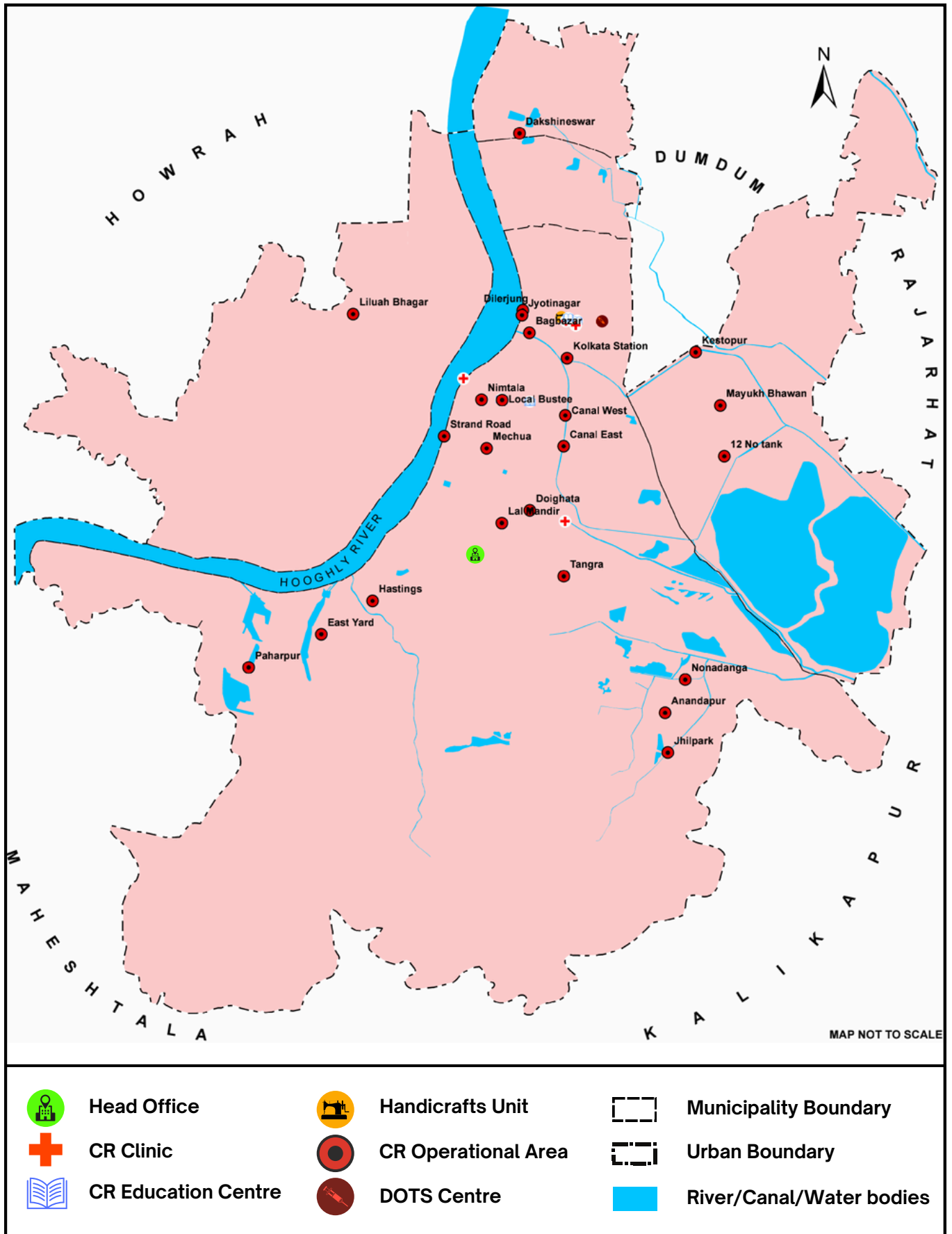

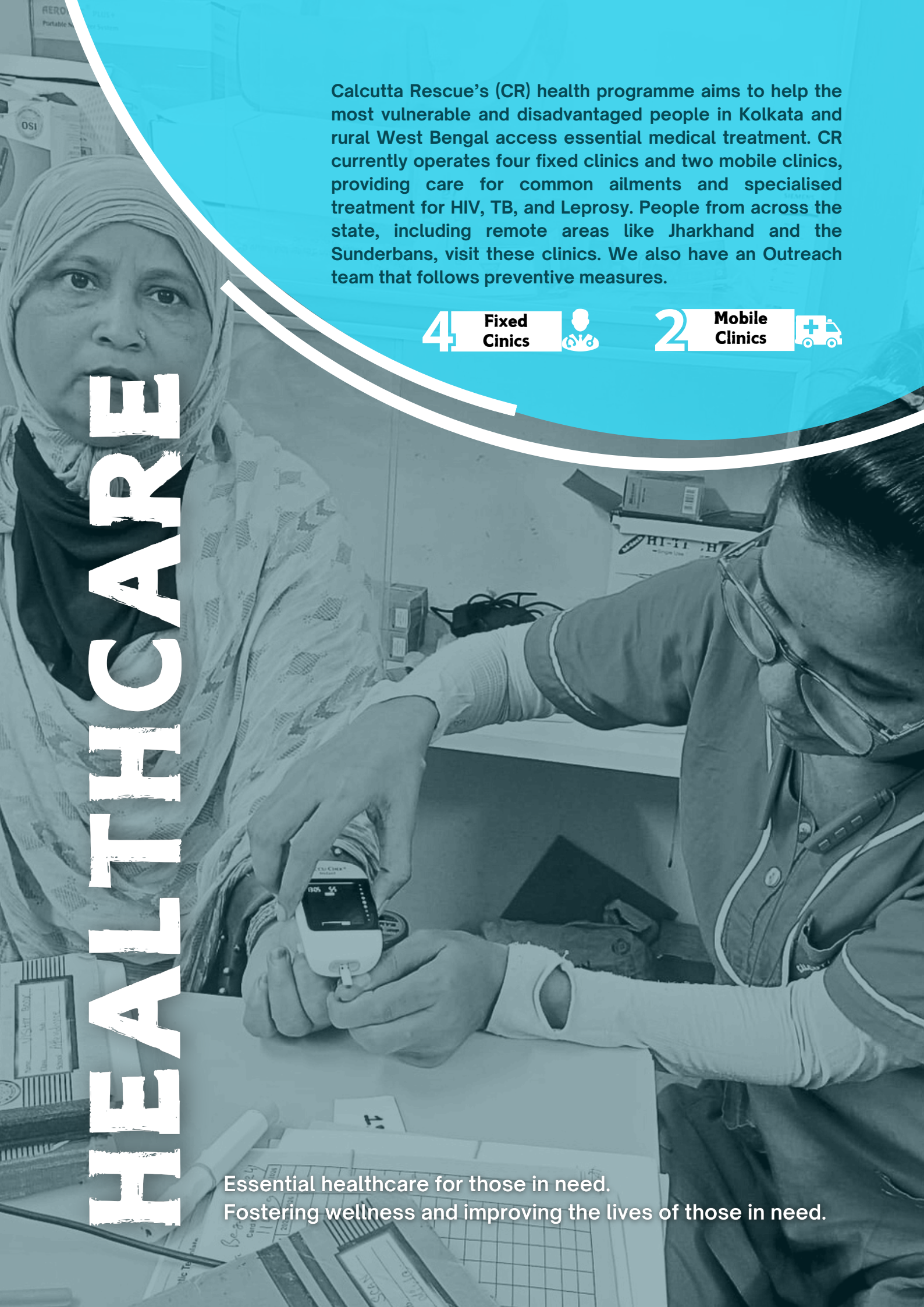

Calcutta Rescue's (CR) health programme aims to help the most vulnerable and disadvantaged people in Kolkata and rural West Bengal access essential medical treatment. CR currently operates four fixed clinics and two mobile clinics, providing care for common ailments and specialised treatment for HIV, TB, and Leprosy. People from across the state, including remote areas like Jharkhand and the Sunderbans, visit these clinics. We also have an Outreach team that follows preventive measures.

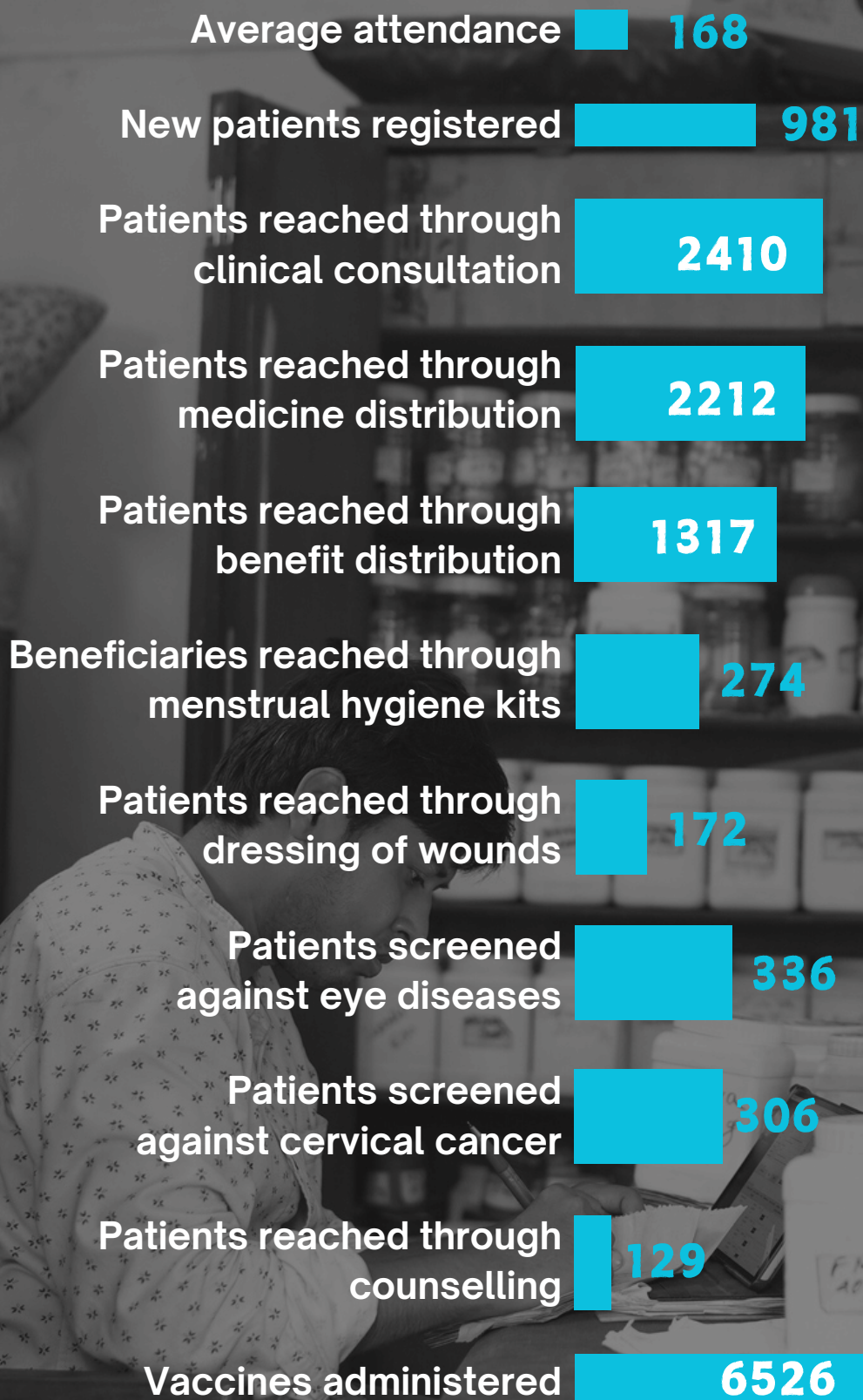

HOPE AMIDST DESPAIR. RISHAV'S JOURNEY

In the Nimtala slum, 5-year-old Rishav lost an arm and a leg when a train passed by as he slept on the tracks. His family, reliant on his father's earnings, struggled with the aftermath. A neighbour helped get Rishav to a government hospital for surgery, but treatment costs were daunting. Calcutta Rescue's Nimtala clinic became their lifeline, providing medical attention and nutrition over two years. Rishav received a prosthetic leg and will soon get a prosthetic arm. Now 7, Rishav is a vibrant boy who enjoys drawing and playing carrom with friends.



INNOVATIVE WOUND HEALING PROCESS

Calcutta Rescue introduced advanced foam-based silicone dressings for better patient comfort and infection prevention. Proposed by Dr. Moona Banerjee, a long-term medical volunteer and supporter from the UK, said these dressings hydrate chronic wounds, making them easier to heal.

SPECIAL MOTHER AND CHILD HEALTH PROGRAMME- 1000 DAYS CARE PROGRAMME

In collaboration with Fundación Colores De Calcuta, CR launched the 1000 Days Care program under its Mother and Child health initiative, providing comprehensive care from pregnancy until the child's second birthday.

INAUGURATION OF TOPSIA CLINIC

On December 15, Calcutta Rescue opened a Mother and Child Health clinic in Topsia, in collaboration with Friends of Calcutta. Operating twice a week, the clinic has a team of seven, including a doctor, pharmacist, and nurse. The outreach team also conducts occasional awareness sessions.

DOTS CLINIC YIELDED A REMARKABLE RESULT

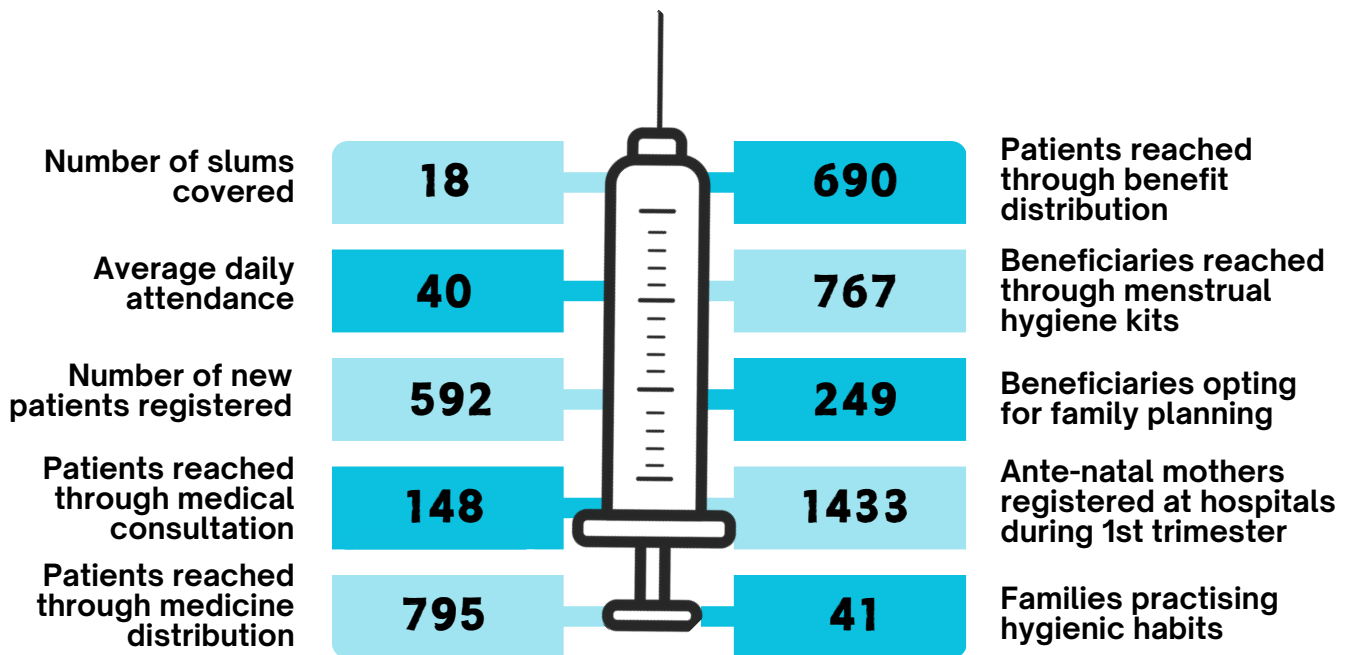

Calcutta Rescue’s street medicine program provides basic check-ups, vaccinations, and health education to marginalised street and slum populations. It monitors those with existing conditions, as well as expectant and new mothers. Community Health Workers (CHWs) play a key role in delivering care and raising awareness in the local language, addressing the unique health challenges these communities face.



A NEW STEP FOR SUJATA



53-year-old Sujata, living in Kolkata station slum with her family, faced a dire situation when a bike accident caused a severe foot injury. Initially treated at a government hospital, her wound worsened, leading to fears of amputation. Unable to afford private care, she sought help from Calcutta Rescue's Street Medicine team. With daily wound dressings and proper medication, Sujata's condition improved significantly over two months. Now, she can walk again, expressing heartfelt gratitude to the Calcutta Rescue team for their lifesaving support.

Outreach Beneficiaries

Starting in the latter part of 2021, Calcutta Rescue's awareness and prevention of diseases approach is called Outreach. Two teams are deployed in 14 slum areas. Each team consists of 3 members who provide the slum dwellers with awareness sessions through interactive discussions. They also communicate directly with the designated Community Health Workers (CHWs) of the slum area and train them as well to serve their slum areas.

This year, the Outreach team collaborated with government social security schemes like Integrated Child Development Services and collaborated on sensitisation of mother and child health as per the government framework.

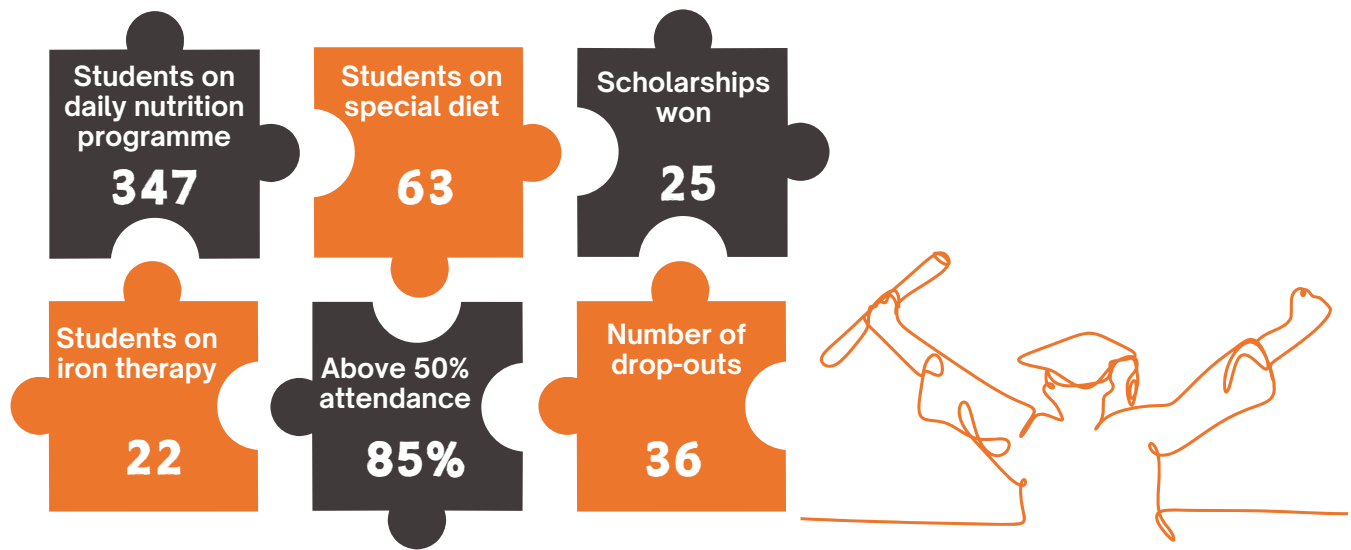

20-year-old Kaikasha values self-sufficiency, enabling her to support her family, meet her needs, and pursue her hobbies. Her journey began at Calcutta Rescue’s No. 10 education centre, where she studied for 15 years. Living nearby with her parents and two siblings, Kaikasha’s father sells fruits, and her brother had to leave school to work.

A dedicated student and talented dancer, Kaikasha pursued commerce after class 12 and sought a part-time job. With help from Calcutta Rescue’s vocational training manager, she completed an Advanced Diploma in Financial Accountancy. On July 13, 2023, she began working part-time at an accounting firm, earning 8000 rupees monthly to support her family.

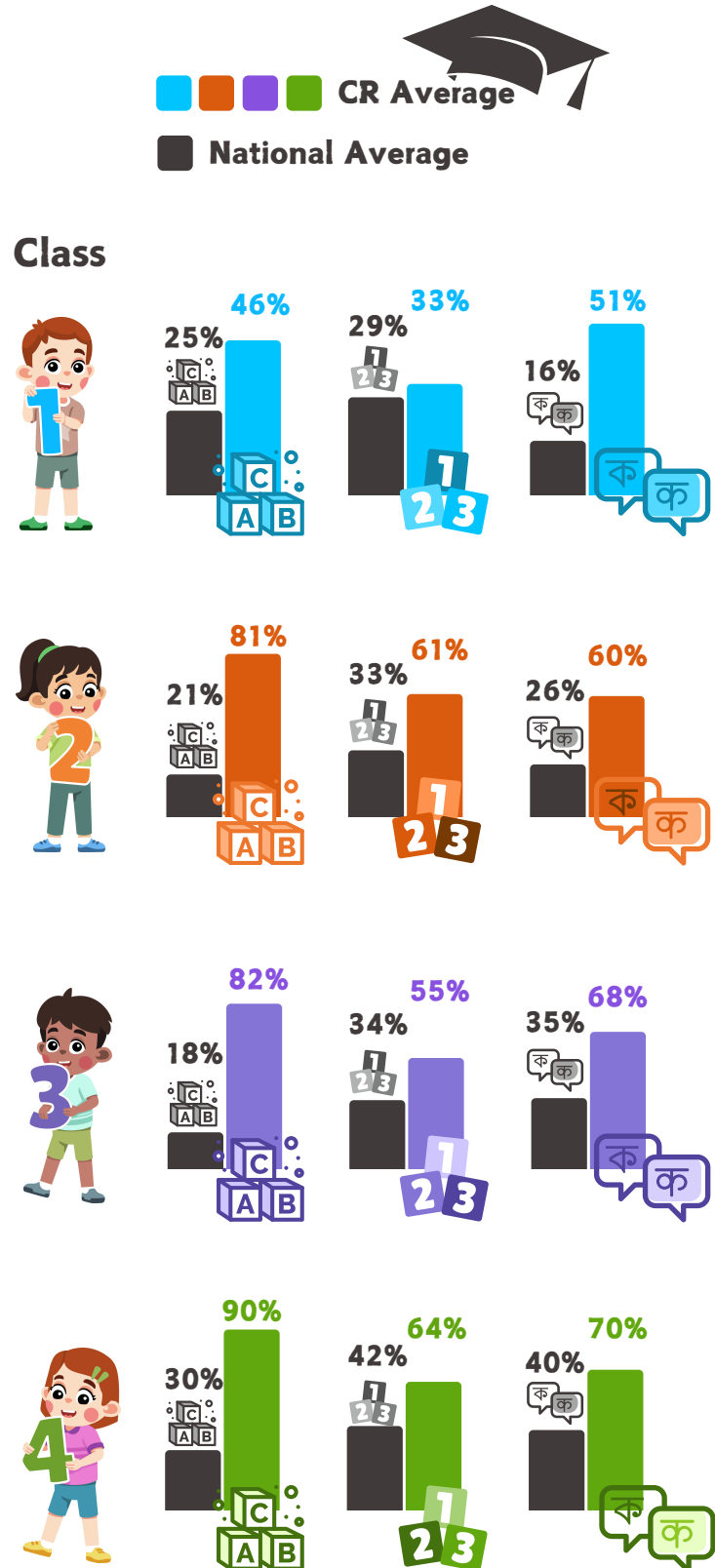


Special Initiatives: Photovoice

In November 2023, Dutch photographer Karijn Kakabeeke and Esther Sulkers, chair of the Calcutta Rescue Research Collaborative, visited Kolkata to train students and the outreach team. Twenty students learned photography skills and captured images reflecting gender equality, a major issue in India. They discussed their photos, identified common themes, and held an exhibition for staff, parents, and guests.

Students of Calcutta Rescue are always ahead of the National Annual Status ASER test result.

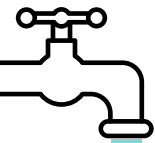

The Living Standards program aims to improve access to clean water, safe drinking water, proper sanitation, durable housing, and concrete roads in urban slums. This initiative arose from our Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) Survey and field observations by CR staff, highlighting the urgent need to address these critical issues. By enhancing basic living conditions, the program helps communities build resilience and reduce their vulnerability to medical emergencies, environmental shocks, and climate change.

Our compost project is expanding

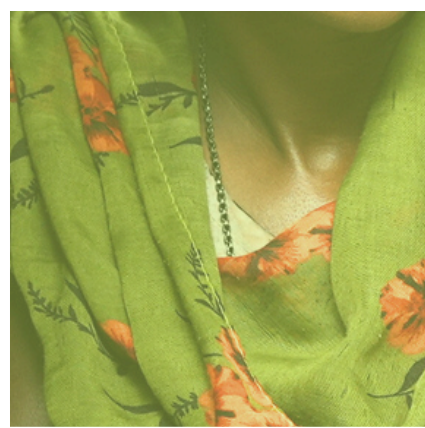
Project Kiran, supported by CESC Ltd, was initiated in 2022 to convert biodegradable waste into compost, has evolved significantly. It not only addresses environmental concerns but also provides supplementary income for slum dwellers who can sell the compost. Supported by CESC, this is one of Calcutta Rescue's special projects.

Initially, there were only two compost pits, but the recent increase in demand for compost has necessitated higher production. Consequently, the project is being expanded with six new pits. The construction began in late February.





Aside from the two workers, Project Kiran has made a Self Help Group uniting the women of the Dakshineswar slum area. Most of the women are domestic helpers. They sell the compost at their workplace and nursery shops and earn money.

HANDICRAFTS

The Pamela Wynn Calcutta Rescue Handicrafts Centre was founded 31 years ago. The project provides training and employment to Calcutta Rescue's past patients who don't have any other way to earn money, students who dropped out of formal education, and domestic abuse survivors.

RESTORATION OF LIVELIHOODS PROJECT

Started during the pandemic, the project has grown into one of the leading embroidery training institutes in north Kolkata for women from impoverished families. It is a 4 month-long course on tailoring and hand embroidery designed for slum dwellers.

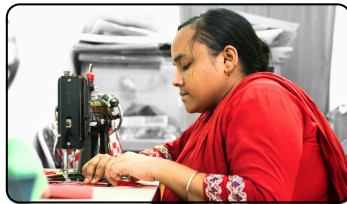

COLLABORATION WITH SINGER INDIA

From November 2023, Calcutta Rescue Handicrafts collaborated with Singer India and is now affiliated with Singer India; the course structure also changed accordingly. The previous 4-month long course has now evolved into a 6-month certificate course and a one-year diploma course.

STARTED AS A STUDENT, THEN BECAME A TEACHER.

Muskan, 25, from Barrackpore, struggled with low-paying jobs while supporting her sick father and homemaker mother. In 2022, she joined Calcutta Rescue's handicrafts training program, where her dedication to learning embroidery impressed the team.

After completing her training, she received a sewing machine and began earning through local orders. Her skills eventually led her to become a trainer in the Restoration of Livelihoods project, allowing her to support her family.

RESEARCH

Over the past five years, Calcutta Rescue (CR) has actively expanded its research activity. CR has developed an institutional research strategy which focuses on three core research areas:



Research on the multidimensional nature of poverty;



Research on nutrition especially in pregnant and lactating women and young children;



Research on factors related to the prevention of diseases and the promotion of (mental) health.

CR research is coordinated by a task force of former long-term volunteers with research expertise, CEO Jaydeep Chakraborty, and local staff. This group established a structure to ensure quality control and accountability in CR's research.

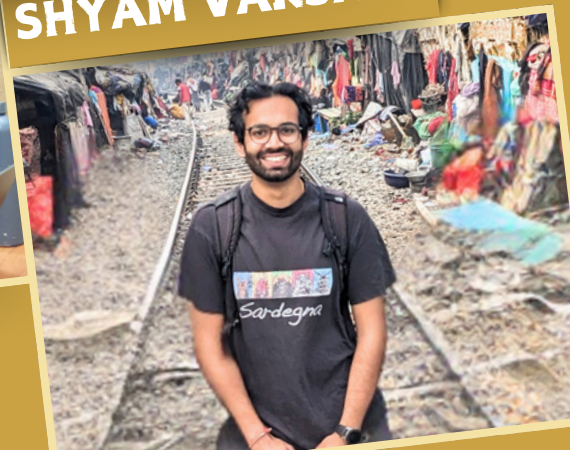
In the past financial year, two major research projects were conducted: 1. a 5-year follow-up of the 2019 multidimensional poverty (MPI) study and 2. an impact evaluation of the adolescent gender equality program in CR schools.

For the 2024 MPI Project, we conducted 1,000+ interviews across 22 slums from January to April.



Ryan Cadman and Shyam Varsani, two volunteer researchers headed the survey. The research has been guided by Dr Suman Seth and the results have been analysed by researcher Subharthi Pradhan.



21 Interns

were trained to perform these interviews in Kolkata's challenging slum conditions. The data shows significant progress, especially in healthcare areas like family planning, antenatal vaccine completion, and health education.



The Gender Equality Study

showed significant improvement in attitudes towards gender norms, tolerance of violence, and school absence due to chores among adolescents in the program. These positive changes, seen over just 18 months, suggest CR's multi-component gender equality program, which addresses gender issues at various social levels, is an effective approach.

Calcutta Rescue's HR team works on recruiting, onboarding, training, and administering employee benefits.

TRAINING OF TRAINERS FOR ADOLESCENT GIRLS PROGRAMME

Calcutta Rescue identified adolescent girls in six slums as a key focus due to rising issues. In response, they launched a project addressing health, menstrual awareness, cyber safety, nutrition, and teenage pregnancy prevention. The SM and outreach teams organized a three-day Training of Trainers (TOT) for 21 staff, using role-playing for effective delivery. Six Bengali modules were developed, field-tested, and standardized for consistent messaging in all sessions. CR also plans to develop an adolescent policy.

PWC SDC VOLUNTEERS ARRANGED STAFF TRAINING

PricewaterhouseCoopers Service Delivery Centre (PwC SDC) volunteers visited and provided Microsoft Excel and PowerPoint training to the Calcutta Rescue staff.



THE NEW EDUCATION PROJECT PAATHSHAALA IS NOW COMPLETE

Calcutta Rescue's long-standing dream is finally achieved as the new education project building at 20 Iswar Mill Lane is completely done and draped in colours. Without the generous support from all the support groups, the Paharpur Foundation, Ms Shamita Ray and the Verdina Foundation this would not have been possible.

PEER- LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP AND GENDER AWARENESS WORKSHOP

In collaboration with Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives, Calcutta Rescue empowered adolescent girls with life skills to become change agents in their slums. Four girls from CR's education and health projects attended a four-day Peer Leadership Workshop, learning communication, human rights, and problem-solving through interactive activities. A three-day workshop by the Azim Premji Foundation explored gender, sexuality, power, and patriarchy through discussions, film screenings, and group activities, challenging traditional perspectives on gender and societal norms.

CERTIFICATION FOR TEACHERS

The Helga Todd Teacher's Education Foundation, an educational charity based in the UK, was established in 2008 by Ram Todd, an Indian philanthropist, in memory of his late wife, Helga. Over the past two years, the foundation has been actively involved in providing specialized training modules to enhance the skills of Calcutta Rescue teachers. Upon completing the training courses, Mr. Ben Taubman, who has been closely engaged with the Calcutta Rescue Education Project, visited the teachers to present them with special certificates.

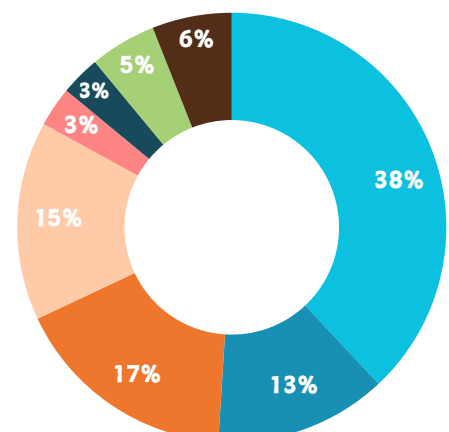
